Are you or your children registered with the Maniapoto Maori Trust Board (MMTB) Tribal Register? If so, parents can make application on their children's behalf for the Primary and Secondary School Grant.

If you have affiliations to Rereahu-Maniapoto iwi, but have not yet registered, you can download registration forms from the website www.maniapoto.iwi.nz. You and your children must be registered to be eligible for this grant. Forms can also be collected from the school office.

Payment of this grant will be made directly to your child's/ children's nominated school account. **Payment will not be made** to a personal bank account.

It is highly recommended that parents/caregivers make contact with schools to discuss where you would like this grant to be used to benefit your child/ren.

THE GREAT KIWI COMPETITIONS

The University of Canterbury is offering your child the opportunity to participate in the Great KIWI English, Mathematics and Science competitions. These competitions take place annually and are designed by New Zealand teachers for New Zealand students based on the New Zealand curriculum. The competitions are administered by the Centre for Evaluation and Monitoring (CEM) at the University of Canterbury. The competitions are open to all Year 5–10 students in English, Mathematics and Science. Students can enter in one or more subjects. The competition provides teachers, parents and students with an independent, comprehensive record of a student's performance in key school subjects. The supervised online tests will take place in the last 3 weeks of Term 2. Certificates will be sent to all participating students and prizes will be awarded to top students.

Payment must be received by the College by Monday 21st May. Each subject entered costs \$8.50.



The International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS) is an independent, skills-based assessment programme which recognises and rewards student achievement. The programme has been running for more than 30 years. Every year 1 million student entries are accepted from over 6 300 schools in Australia and New Zealand annually. Students from over 20 countries participate in ICAS each year.

Piopio College students have the opportunity to enter these external tests and sit them at the College. They are best attempted by students who are academically able. The following tests are available:

It should be noted that these tests are sent to Australia to be marked and in previous years there has been considerable delay in receiving firstly the results (via an online portal) and then another delay until the certificates and official results sheet is sent. I have a few previous years' test papers which the students can borrow to help them prepare. Practise papers with answers can also be purchased online. Please send the appropriate fee(s) into the College by the closing date listed if you wish your child to enter these competitions.

DODGING BOMBS, SNAKES AND LEECHES, ALL IN A DAY'S WORK FOR FORMER PIOPIO COLLEGE DUX

Patrick Turner spent last year in the jungles of Laos along the Ho Chi Minh trail dodging unexploded bombs and fending off green vipers and leeches.

He found an untapped source of gold near the Vietnam border, so he named it Tikitiki, after the road he grew up on in Piopio.

Two days after the discovery, he cut 27 leeches from his body - far short of his record of 48 leeches in one day, though.

Travelling to remote jungles might be a bucket list wish for some, but for Turner, it's all in a day's work.

The exploration geologist hails from a tiny rural settlement about halfway between New Plymouth and Hamilton.

He was the 2007 dux of Piopio College.

"The variety of opportunities available at a small country school with less people to go around means that there are plenty of opportunities to take on various roles and responsibilities," Turner said.

"Being at a small country school did not hinder any chances for tertiary education."

Ten years on, 29-year-old Turner has done what 18-year-old Turner said he would do; get a double degree at the University of Canterbury - a Bachelor of Science, majoring in geology, and a Bachelor of Arts, majoring in French, Spanish and German.

He then went on to complete a master's degree.

Turner works on a variety of projects within Australia and Laos and is based in Christchurch but travels frequently.

In 2017, while in Laos, he was the Geological Team Leader for a greenfield and near mine exploration programme.

The work involved the determination of targets, drill hole targeting, logistics, organisation, supervision and sampling of rock chips, stream sediment, soil samples, geological trenches, mapping and interpretation of geophysics survey.

When Turner's not in the bush or the jungle, he's in either Christchurch or Australia.

"At the end of 2011 I picked up a graduate geologist/environmental scientist position at CRL Energy, which is based in Christchurch, and worked between 20 hours a week to fulltime until the end of my master's degree."

He spent six months working at CRL Energy before taking on his current role in May 2016 at Terra Search Ltd based in Townsville, Australia.

"My fiancé (now wife) at that time had a good job in Christchurch and has remained there whilst I gallivant around Australia and Southeast Asia for work."

Turner said if there was any advice he could offer students, especially those nearing the end of their high school years, it's to be aggressive and not to sit back and wait for things to happen, but to "make them happen".

"Take responsibility of your actions or inactions. Don't blame others for where you are or what you are doing, take ownership of your situation and keep moving forward."
