#### **NZPPTA PAID UNION MEETING**

On Wednesday 23 May, teachers who belong to the NZPPTA will be attending a Paid Union Meeting in Hamilton. The teachers' employment contract allows them to hold two of these meetings each year. They will be leaving at 11.00am.

This means that we will only be able to teach periods 1 and 2 on Wednesday 23 May. The following options are available for students:

#### 1. Remain at school for supervised activities.

A small number of teachers will be on site, but there will not be any normal classes. Buses will run at the normal time.

NB - We are running a structured programme for all Year 11 and a small group of Year 12 students. These students will be given specific instructions through a letter from the English/ Maths department.

#### 2. Return to their own home.

- Town students may walk home.

#### 3. Given the very short teaching day, you may choose to keep students at home.

Kia ora koutou,

Our Piopio College BOT have been busy attending leadership workshops, collaborative hui with other educational institutes, community meetings with the Police Commission, and kept on our toes with weekly internal meetings within our school. It amazes me how much responsibility the Government places on our BOT's to make decisions, lead schools, and implement policies and procedures without actually working in the place you are governing.
