I would like to remind parents of the upcoming NZPPTA Paid Union Meeting on Wednesday 23 May, as per last week's newsletter.

Teachers who belong to the NZPPTA will be attending a Paid Union Meeting in Hamilton. The teachers' employment contract allows them to hold two of these meetings each year. They will be leaving at 11.00am. This means that we will only be able to teach periods 1 and 2 on Wednesday 23 May.

The following options are available for students:

1. Remain at school for supervised activities.

A small number of teachers will be on site, but there will not be any regular classes. Buses will run at the normal time.

NB – We are running a structured programme for Year 11 and a small group of Year 12 students. These students will be given specific instructions through a letter from the English and Maths departments.

2. Return to their own home.

- They may not go into Piopio, or stay at a friend's house in Piopio to wait for their bus.
- Town students may walk home.

3. Given the very short teaching day, you may choose to keep students at home.


