Dear Parents/ Caregivers,

This letter is to inform you of a slight change with how the Parnell students will be billeted. Originally as a host family, you had agreed to having a student(s) to stay for 4 nights. Now you are able to make a choice of 1, 2 or 3 nights of hosting from the 26th November to the 29th November. Due to Health and Safety Legislation, if you do choose to take a student, we are required to have each host family police vetted. (and all people over 18 in the household).

Day 1

Day 2-4

Day 5

Parnell students will return to the College in the morning to travel back to Auckland. Please provide lunch for your billet on this day.

Our Parnell exchange has been going for well over twenty years now and provides our students with a life.long. learning experience. For this tradition to continue it is essential to have families willing to host Parnell students as this is the success to the exchange.
